Sailings visit Tracy Arm Fjord, Wrangell, Fredrick Sound, Glacier Bay National Park, Icy Strait Point, and Sitka.





ELEVATING YOUR EXPERIENCE

With only eleven highways in the state, 82% of Alaska's communities are inaccessible by road, and when you do not have a road, you go by plane or boat. That can pose a challenge for visitors who want access to glaciers, remote communities, or Alaska's outback. Getting around from one location to the next requires a lot of maneuvering, but our team can pull it off without a hitch, and for guests traveling with John Hall's Alaska, it is part of the fun!

To best view Alaska's massive tidewater glaciers and wildlife-rich waters we charter local Alaskan-owned sightseeing boats capable of maneuvering through ice-filled fjords, near sea lion haulouts, and in feeding grounds popular with orcas and humpback whales. On our winter tours, guests enjoy sled dog rides through boreal forests or guided snow machining in Alaska's hills. With trips above the Arctic Circle and to world-famous national parks, there are small plane expeditions. Our tours clearly indicate when plane travel is included on an itinerary, and when it is an enriching option.

LUXURY MOTORCOACHES

When traveling by road, our fleet of custom-built MCI luxury motorcoaches is the best in all of Alaska. Their spacious build features extended legroom, restrooms, flat-screen TVs, surround sound, roomy aisles, Alaska/Yukon libraries, beverage galleys with Keurig coffee makers, and 110v power outlets at every seat for charging your electronics. Alaska Culture & Lifestyle

GREAT EXPECTATIONS

Multifaceted springs to mind when defining Alaska's regions, cultures, and lifestyles and the role they play in the John Hall's Alaska experience. During our forty-plus years of touring and exploring, sharing all that makes Alaska's First People special continues to be a top priority. You should expect nothing less.

We put in the miles covering Alaska's five geographic regions: Far North/Arctic, Interior, Southcentral, Southeast, and Southwest – many of which require access by plane or boat. We do that, too. Aside from the wildlife and beauty, within these regions also lie sacred Native homelands dating back thousands of years.

Iñupiat

Subsisting on what the land provides – fishing, hunting, gathering – the lñupiat hail from the northern and northwestern Far North/Arctic region. Our guests fly in by small plane, meet locals, and enjoy visits to Native villages, cultural centers, museums, and learning about the heritage of the lñupiat people.

Dena'ina Athabascan

From Alaska's northern Interior to the shores of Southcentral, the Bering Sea, and into Canada, these migratory and resourceful traders crafted canoes, sleds, and clothing from nature's bounty. Explore a living Athabascan village and Dena'ina encampment, and in winter, visit an Iditarod checkpoint at a local village.

Unangax & Sugpiaq (Aleut)

An existence dependent upon the sea, the Aleuts lived in semisubterranean houses in the Southwest's Aleutian Islands and in Southcentral along Prince William Sound. Forever influenced by the Russians, discover their intriguing history, and explore their homelands on flightseeing trips, bear viewing, and in museums.

Yup'ik & Cup'ik

The traditional ways are passed to younger generations through stories from elders, and shared in cultural centers with guests. The Yup'ik and Cup'ik live a life sustained by the land and sea, and while housing varied, semi-subterranean homes were common in the Southwest and southern reaches of the Far North.

Tlingit, Haida, Tsimshian & Eyak

Their clans have inhabited Alaska's Southeast panhandle for over 10,000 years. Tlingit, Haida, Tsimshian, and Eyak are talented craftspeople known for weaving and carving – baskets, clothing, totems, canoes, and tools. At tribal houses and museums, immerse into the culture through storytelling, totems, dance, and art.

Cultural Tourism Partnerships

GIFTS THAT KEEP GIVING

Being a good citizen and giving guests a rich, authentic cultural experience is a top priority and a John Hall's Alaska founding principle. Luckily, we have had the good fortune to build many lasting partnerships working directly with Native communities and businesses to spread cultural awareness and help communities thrive.

PRESERVING CULTURE

John Hall's Alaska has been acknowledged for our continued sustainability efforts in the Alaska tourism industry for supporting local communities and helping to preserve cultures. Cultural partners and experiences around the state include:

- Iñupiat Heritage Center visit and Utqiagvik cultural tour
- Simon Paneak Memorial Museum in Anaktuvuk Pass showcases Nunamiut Eskimo/Iñupiat history
- Iditarod checkpoint located at a remote Dene/ Athabascan village
- Living Athabascan village on a riverboat tour in Fairbanks
- Icy Strait Point Tlingit cultural storytelling and a dance performance
- Sitka National Historical Park Tlingit and Haida totems, artifacts, and history
- Doyon Limited operates the Denali National Park bus tours
- Bristol Bay Native Corporation Katmai Air flightseeing and Brooks Falls visit in Katmai National Park
- Anchorage Museum over 600 artifacts highlighting Alaska's Native culture
- Huna Tribal House visit in Glacier Bay with traditional art and storytelling
- Carrie M. McLain Memorial Museum and Katirvik Cultural Center visits in Nome
- Visit a Dena'ina Encampment in Talkeetna and learn about their history
- Tlingit dancers perform at the Sheet'ka Kwaan Naa Kahidi Community House in Sitka

National Parks of Alaska & Canada

GO FARTHER, EXPERIENCE MORE

John Hall's Alaska is the only tour company offering itineraries that visit seven of Alaska's eight national parks, plus three celebrated parks in Canada. Learning a bit more about each park may help to narrow down your itinerary choices:

Denali National Park & Preserve

A highlight of Alaska's Interior, in summer, guests spend two days exploring the park, increasing your chance of seeing the elusive Denali, North America's highest mountain peak. Our land tours feature a tour 42 miles into the park in search of Denali's Big Five wildlife, and opportunities for ziplining, flightseeing, ATVing, or whitewater rafting.

Gates of the Arctic National Park & Preserve

In Alaska's Far North region sits a vast landscape surrounded by the peaks and glaciers of the Brooks Range, there are no roads or official trails. The park protects populations of caribou, wolves, bears, Dall sheep, and mountain goats.

Glacier Bay National Park & Preserve

Covering 3.3 million acres of coastline, fjords, rainforest, and mountains, this UNESCO World Heritage Site in Southeast Alaska is home to over 1,000 glaciers. Bear, moose, Dall's sheep, puffins, and other wildlife can be spotted in the park.

Katmai National Park & Preserve

Situated in southwest Alaska, Katmai is known for spectacular bear viewing and the Valley of Ten Thousand Smokes, a notable volcanic basin. It also claims the highest concentration of prehistoric dwellings in North America.

Kenai Fjords National Park

The ice age lingers in South Central, Alaska. The almost 40 glaciers that flow from the Harding Icefield helped to shape this land of constant change and rich ecosystems. Both land and marine wildlife are within sight during your time here.

Lake Clark National Park & Preserve

Turquoise glacial lakes, steaming volcanoes, alpine tundra, rainforests, craggy mountains, and salmon-laden streams. Your only access is by small aircraft or boat, but the varied ecosystem supports almost all Alaska's major wildlife.

Wrangell-St. Elias National Park & Preserve

An International Biosphere Reserve, the park is the largest in the U.S. National Park system and home to three of North America's five tallest peaks. Mount St. Elias stands at 18,008 ft. and is the second-tallest mountain in the U.S.

Banff National Park | Alberta, Canada

Nestled in the heart of the Canadian Rockies, the mountain scenery and bright waters of Lake Louise are a highlight of this UNESCO World Heritage Site. Wildlife such as elk and Stone sheep roam the park's expanse.

Jasper National Park | Alberta, Canada

It is the largest national park in the Alberta Rockies, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and home to First Nations dating back thousands of years. A highlight, the Icefields Parkway, is one of the world's only icefields accessible by road.

Kluane National Park | Yukon Territory, Canada

Affectionately nicknamed Canada's "gem," this UNESCO World Heritage Site holds one of the largest mosaics of plants and animals in all of Canada. Mount Logan, Canada's highest peak, is only 700 ft shorter than Denali.

Alaska's Top Wildlife

ENCOUNTERING WILDLIFE

While sightings of specific species are never guaranteed, John Hall's Alaska visits more national parks and includes a wide range of exclusive activities that surely increase the odds of checking a few sightings off your list!

Depending on your tour, opportunities include: bears catching salmon at Brooks Falls, a Kodiak bear flightseeing trip, or Fortress of the Bear on Baranof Island; marine life viewing in Kenai Fjords National Park, Prince William Sound, Devil's Canyon, Inside Passage, or Stikine River; on a Denali National Park wildlife tour; cruising in Glacier Bay National Park; or on visits to a musk ox farm, or the Alaska Wildlife Conservation Center, Alaska SeaLife Center, Alaska Raptor Center where injured wildlife rehabilitate.

ALASKA'S BIG FIVE

Caribou • Moose • Wolf Brown Bear • Dall Sheep

To evade predators, Dall Sheep navigate high ridges. Look for moose along roads and feeding near wetlands. Bears prefer coastal shores, salmon streams, and fields of berries.

Migratory caribou frequent the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge and mountains north of Anchorage. The wolf is the most elusive, count yourself lucky!

RAPTORS, PASSERINES & SEABIRDS

Puffin • Ptarmigan • Loon • Bald Eagle Horned Puffin • Golden Eagle • Kittiwake

The birds are vibrant in Alaska! With nearly 500 species of large and small birds found throughout the state, it is a birders paradise.

MARINE LIFE

Humpback Whale • Sea Lion • Sea Otter Harbor Seal • Orca • Ringed Seal • Dall's Porpoise

Alaska's waterways are rich with marine life. Keep watch on the horizon for the telltale sign of a whale's blow, Dall's porpoise swimming in the wake of your boat, and playful sea lions, seals, and otters lounging on rocks and bergy bits.


