Overnight: DoubleTree Suites by Hilton

2 Seattle, WA & Kamloops, British Columbia
After a group welcome breakfast, head north with Puget Sound and the Olympic Range to the west and the Cascade Mountains to the east. Once across the Canadian border, follow the Fraser River before crossing the Cascades to Kamloops, the wine country of British Columbia.

Overnight: South Thompson Inn

3 Three Valley Gap, BC & Lake Louise, Alberta

The frontier spirit lives on at the heritage ghost town of Three Valley Gap with its carefully restored, historic buildings (some dating back to 1865). Following lunch, carry on to Lake Louise - world-famous for its turquoise lakes, the Victoria Glacier, and soaring mountain backdrop.

Overnight: Lake Louise Inn

4 Banff National Park, AB
Nestled in Canada's oldest national park, spend today in the town of Banff. Take a ride up Sulphur Mountain on the Banff Gondola and at the top, enjoy lunch with a view, short hiking trails, and the interpretive center. Swing by glacially-fed Lake Louise and Moraine Lake and take in their unique turquoise blues.

Overnight: Lake Louise Inn

5 Columbia Icefield, AB
Astride the Continental Divide sits the Columbia Icefield, look for mountain sheep and elk on the way. Tour the icefield for a fascinating geological story, ride the Ice Explorer coach to walk on top of Athabasca Glacier, and enjoy lunch perched on the side of the glacier. Just off the Icefields Parkway - voted one of the most scenic drives in the world - view thundering Athabasca Falls.

Overnight: Overlander Mountain Lodge

6 Canadian Rockies & Dawson Creek, BC

A day of driving requires two things, top-notch scenery, and a luxury ride - you have both. Cross the rugged landscapes of the Rockies to the dry, windy prairies of northeastern British Columbia. Enjoy the sights and keep watch for wildlife on the way to Dawson Creek, or "Mile 0 City," the start of the Alaska Highway.

Overnight: Stonebridge Hotel

7 Alaska Highway & Fort Nelson, BC

Begin your journey on the Alaska Highway. Built for military purposes in 1942, its nickname was the "oil can highway" due to the volume of discarded oil cans and fuel drums marking the road's progress. Over the next six days, travel all 1,387 miles. Overnight in Fort Nelson, once a fur-trading post.

Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Overnight: Woodlands Inn & Suites

8 Stone Mountain Provincial Park & Muncho Lake, BC

Begin at Fort Nelson Heritage Museum, then witness steep topography, created by glaciation, in Stone Mountain Provincial Park. Keep your eyes open on the way to Muncho Lake. Golden eagles, Stone's sheep, bison, moose, elk, deer, caribou, and grizzlies all claim the turf. Relax on the banks of this jade green, alpine lake.

Overnight: Northern Rockies Lodge

9 Watson Lake, Yukon

Travel through spectacular scenery and wildlife-dense areas to Watson Lake, your entry into Yukon Territory. Closely tied to the highway's construction, what began as a fish camp and small airstrip now bustles as a favorite stop for travelers.

Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Overnight: Andrea's Hotel

10 Whitehorse, Yukon

In Watson Lake, a must-stop is Sign Post Forest. In 1942 a homesick U.S. Army Corps of Engineers G.I. working on the highway put up a sign for his hometown and today, its two acres boast over 80,000 signs. Explore Whitehorse, where First Nations lived for thousands of years before gold-seeking stampeders began arriving in 1897.

Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Overnight: Edgewater Hotel

11 Kluane National Park, YT & Tok, Alaska

Mountains and glaciers dominate Kluane National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Stop at Da Ku Cultural Center, a recreation of a traditional village. Keep watch for wildlife, especially bears and sheep. Cross the U.S.-Canadian border and continue to Tok, Alaska.

Overnight: Young's Motel

12 Alaska Range & Trail Breaker Kennel

Take in the Alaska Range - one of the world's highest - to milepost "1422" in Delta Junction, the end of the Alaska Highway. Stop at the Trans-Alaska Pipeline, and in North Pole, Alaska, visit the Santa Claus House. At Trail Breaker Kennel - home of the late four-time Iditarod champion Susan Butcher

- enjoy dinner and an exclusive look at kennel life.

Overnight: Bear Lodge

13 Fairbanks & Chena River

Board the Riverboat Discovery and embark on a three-hour tour on the Chena River and at a living Athabaskan village, learn how they skillfully survived for over 10,000 years. Discover a world-class collection of automobiles and fashions at the Fountainhead Antique Auto Museum. Enjoy a savory salmon bake and an entertaining review at the Palace Theatre.

Overnight: Bear Lodge

14 Alaska Railroad & Denali National Park

Rise early for a scenic rail journey to Denali National Park. Travel aboard the GoldStar cars of the Alaska Railroad, complete with a glass-domed ceiling and breakfast with a view! Relax this evening surrounded by nature.

Overnight: Denali Bluffs Hotel

15 Denali National Park & Knik River

On a sightseeing bus ride 42 miles deep in Denali National Park, keep watch for moose, caribou, Dall sheep, wolves, grizzlies, and of course Denali. Then, journey south to Knik River. Settle into your cabin and enjoy the mountain setting.

Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Overnight: Knik River Lodge

16 Anchorage & Seward

Enjoy the colorful Anchorage Museum, lunch, and a city tour, before heading south along Turnagain Arm to Seward. On the way, stop at the Alaska Wildlife Conservation Center - a sanctuary dedicated to preserving wildlife. Tonight's lodging offers 360-degree views of Resurrection Bay.

Overnight: Harbor 360 Hotel

17 Kenai Fjords National Park

A dream for photography, wildlife, and glacier enthusiasts. On a cruise in Kenai Fjords National Park, view humpbacks, orcas, Steller sea lions, otters, eagles, puffins, and several tidewater glaciers, some actively calving! Spend your final evening in Anchorage.
